POLICING PRIORITIES

Residents tell us they are concerned about speeding on the local roads at night.
Conservative councillors on Shropshire
Council and Shrewsbury Town Council are not doing enough on this. Sarah raised these issues with the Safer Neighbourhood team for Harlescott and Sundorne, which also covers Battlefield.

GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

To save money, Tory-controlled Shropshire Council have ignored the results of a consultation and will push ahead with charges for green waste collection. From October, households will need to pay £56 a year and put a sticker on their bin to have their green waste collected.
