## COUNGIL CHARGING FOR SAFETY

 INFORMATION SGANDALI am shocked to learn that Shropshire Council charges the public for information about air quality and road safety．

When a Green Party member tried to find the air quality readings from the air pollution monitoring station at Chester Street（near the railway station）he was faced with a charge of $£ 67.75$ per hour．Previously the readings were available free from the Borough Council website．See for yourself：search＇Shropshire Environmental Information Request＇．

It is equally shocking that you will be charged to find out about the number of road deaths in the area．

I demand that these charges on information are dropped immediately． Neighbouring councils make this information available freely．You have a right to know how safe the air you breathe is．And you have a right to know how safe your roads are．I will be campaigning to make this information freely available via the Council website．

## NEW STREET BLUES

Right now some of our neighbours are struggling daily with the danger of fast travelling two－way traffic on New Street，the area＇s narrowest main road．


I commit to campaigning for an immediate 20 mph limit from Copthorne Road to past the Boat House．I will ask for an early meeting with Council officials to look at long term solutions，including a one－ way system，to make this road safer．

Air pollution is also a concern shared by many people in the area．I have worked with a local resident to install an air quality monitoring tube on the Frankwell end of New Street，the narrowest section of the road．

Meanwhile，the existing monitor－ ing tube on Copthorne Rd near the Barracks thankfully showed acceptable air quality．
