

SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION STARTS

CONSTRUCTION WORK HAS STARTED on the open land at Squinter Pip Way. The primary school and Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) schools have been given planning permission. As part of this there are detailed conditions about how the construction is managed, covering waste materials, drainage and traffic.

For now, a field entrance on a sharp bend is being used for access to the site. Like many local residents we already had concerns about traffic at this corner, and we'll be watching to make sure the traffic is managed safely.

This access should only be used for the first three months, after which the planned school access opposite Morant View is due to open. Access on foot past the site must be kept open, with safety fencing if needed, while the schools are being built. No special provision is being made for people on bicycles, so please let us know if there are any issues.



Our local bus services will be funded beyond next April. More details will follow as soon as we have them.




