

GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

To save money, Tory-controlled Shropshire Council have ignored the results of a consultation and will **push ahead with charges for green waste collections.** From October, households will need to pay £56 a year and put a sticker on their bin to secure collection. Julia and the Green group argued that this change is happening too quickly with no help for alternatives (such as home composting or subsidies for those on low incomes). Food waste collections will stop for everyone, a very short-sighted move. Residents here have also pointed out that they don't always have enough in their green bin to make collections necessary, especially during winter.

Sadly, due to Shropshire Council's financial crisis and staff redundancies, it seems these plans have not been getting the attention we were promised. Our next road safety meeting will be at 7.00pm on Friday the 15th of November at the Community Centre. We plan to ensure officers attend to give us a full progress report.



BOWBROOK MEADOWS AND DARWIN'S WALK

Julia has still not had proper answers about **issues within the estate**, including hand over updates and double yellow lines. The community meadow in Squinter Pip Way is a great opportunity for our area. We will send a letter to local residents soon about how we plan to take this forward.
