Free Evening Car-Parking?

Green Party Councillors on Oswestry Town Council are proposing that the Council car-parks are free after 6pm and that during the day two hours parking is available for just 80p. It would help boost our evening economy, encourage day-time shoppers to stay a little longer and ease congestion on residential areas by allowing town centre residents to use the car-parks overnight. Incredibly, not a single Conservative councillor on the Town Council has supported us on this, but we have pushed for a public consultation so you can have your say. You can take part on-line by going to www.oswestry-tc.gov.uk or you can pick up a car park survey form from the library, the market hall or The Guildhall. If you support this idea, and want to see more consultations in the future, make sure you have your say.

Clean, Green Solar Energy

Oswestry Town Councillors Mike Isherwood and Barry Edwards have been working hard to remedy this. They discovered that funding was available from the Government to undertake a feasibility study to develop our very own community owned energy company that could make this project a reality. It's not been easy - indeed the Government withdrew funding for the scheme on the very week that globally, scientists said that we need to keep within 1.5 degrees of global warming - but we have continued with the work and still hope to see the project begin soon.

If they need to save money maybe they should abandon their plans to spend over £25M on their offices at Shirehall, Shrewsbury.
