The latest news from Shirehall.

As your representative I make a point of not only attending Council meetings but also ask questions on your behalf. I've sought answers on a wide range of issues from Councillor allowances to domestic violence; the sale of Council-owned farms and the impact of future cuts to Housing benefit and I'd be happy to ask a question on your behalf, or help you attend the meeting and ask it yourself! In my view democracy works better when those who have power are held to account. Unfortunately in the past few months we have seen some poor decision-making in the Council chamber, with an extra £20M being spent on computers and a refusal to support the campaign to keep A+E services in Shrewsbury and Telford. I will continue to argue the case for Oswestry and oppose cuts in services and I have made it plain that money can, and should, be found from cutting Councillor allowances and saving back office functions.

What a Waste!

The Smithfield site still lies empty and abandoned with little sign that it will be redeveloped soon, meanwhile the £4M or so paid to the Town Council languishes in the bank slowly depleting because the inflation rate is much higher than the interest rate. I am urging that this wind-fall is used to benefit all the town by getting some of the empty shops re-let. Hopefully with Council elections next spring we might start to see some action!





Cardboard recycling coming soon

It's several years since Shropshire told us we could no longer put cardboard with green waste, and finally their contractor Veolia has designed a new scheme which enables us recycle cardboard once again which is brilliant. Under the new service, which is due to start in November, residents will get a new blue bag for paper and plastics, cans and glass will no longer need to be separated.

Working for you

An excellent campaign by local residents fought off proposals to build these eyesores on the corner of Stewart Road and Salop Road but the site still hasn't been cleared up. I am asking the Planners to pursue the owners and get them to do a proper job and keep the site tidy.



Protecting our NHS



I've been talking about the threat to NHS services for over three years now and although they have spent millions we are still no nearer to knowing what the future holds. I will continue to advocate for the improvement of our Minor Injuries Unit and for the retention of the A+E service in Shrewsbury and Telford. I am heartened that this campaign has been so well supported by the current mayor of Oswestry and thousands of Oswestry people who signed the petition. Let's all keep up the pressure.
