

NO. 20 BUS SERVICE UNDER THREAT

Your councillors Chris Lemon and Julia Evans are doing everything they can to save this service, in response to the huge amount of concern from residents. As one told us – "it's madness" that Radbrook should have no bus service. It is the largest ward in the town and is growing rapidly. The original proposal was to stop the service completely on 22 April, with very little notice. Please look out for the latest news on our FACEBOOK PAGE, RADBROOK AREA GREENS.

We know from many conversations that this is causing immense distress and will lead to real hardship amongst those in our community who have no alternative transport. It will also undoubtedly adversely affect businesses on the 20 route.

OVER 100 PEOPLE CAME TO A MEETING on 6 April at Radbrook Community Centre, and signed the petition to keep the service. It's clear that a bus service is needed for all manner of journeys and by people of all ages from pensioners to people at work and nursery children.

WEST MIDLANDS AMBULANCE SERVICE has informed us via a freedom of information request that they will not try and renew their lease on the depot in Longden Road. The lease runs out in 2027. We are still however pushing for action on road safety as a current priority.

COST OF LIVING CRISIS

NEWS FROM THE MAYOR AND GREEN GROUP **ON SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL**

Shropshire voted on its NEW BUDGET last month. The council is in trouble financially. This is mostly due to government, but there have also been some poor decisions at Shirehall in recent vears.

Led by the Greens, for the first time in many years, alternative proposals were put to the vote. But the Conservative group rejected all ideas along party lines.

The Green group think we must do things differently. Open discussion of ideas at an earlier stage might improve the budget without a party-political bun fight. We will be making suggestions for a different way to make decisions in the coming months, based on good practice elsewhere.

Inflation, fuel cost increases and a national insurance rise are causing real hardship for many. Elsewhere Green led councils have increased support through council tax reductions, hardship funds and support for voluntary organisations that help. Shropshire Council should be doing more. No new help was in the budget, but THE GREENS WON AN AGREEMENT to set up a task force to look for ways to do better.

SCHOOL PROPOSAL

Proposals for the promised SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) and primary schools on Bowbrook Meadows were published recently. The schools are very welcome, for local families and those across Shrewsbury. Your councillors Julia Evans and Chris Lemon were at a drop-in event organised by the developers and raised questions about traffic levels on Squinter Pip Way, as well as the poor design of the school buildings themselves.

Unbelievably in these days of a climate emergency THEY ARE NOT DESIGNED TO BE ENERGY-EFFICIENT. Your councillors will continue to raise this issue during the planning process, along with a request for good walking and cycling routes for pupils. We expect the proposals to go to a planning committee in July and for building to start in September. We'll keep you informed.
